




WHAT YOU WILL PHOTOGRAPH

Below is a guide of the places we will see.

The itinerary could be modified to get the most out of the places and weather conditions.



Aurora Borealis

Aurora Borealis (depending on cloud and aurora conditions). The aurora can never be guaranteed but if the night is clear, we will be chasing!!!

Snæfellsnes Peninsula

First we head to Snæfellsnes Peninsula; including Hraunfossar waterfall, Húsafell, Kirkjufell mountain, Svöðufoss waterfall and other locations on the north side of the peninsula.

On the southern side is Búðir (Black) church, Arnarstapi village, Lóndrangar stacks and Djúpalónssandur. We will of course visit the famous Kirkjufell mountain and Kirkjufellsfoss waterfall.

Iceland South Coast

Then we head to the south coast of Iceland to visit the waterfalls of Seljalandsfoss, Skógafoss, Kvernufoss.

On the coast we also go to Dyrhólaey lighthouse and the black sand beach at Reynisfjara.

Fire & Ice

Iceland is known as the land of fire and ice. So we have to visit the Katla Ice Cave, Jökulsárlón diamond beach. Jökulsárlón and Fjallsárlón glacier lagoon and other glaciers in the area.

Vestrahorn

We also visit Vestrahorn, a photographers dream location where you will definitely need a wide angle lens.

Golden Circle

Finally we visit the Golden circle, Gullfoss waterfall, Geysir geothermal, Brúarfoss waterfall and Thingvellir national park.

Snæfellsnes Serenity 22 September 2024

Embark on your photographic odyssey with a morning pick-up at your Reykjavik hotel. As we traverse towards Snæfellsnes, prepare to be enchanted by the ethereal beauty of Hraunfossar waterfall, Húsafell, Kirkjufell mountain, and other hidden gems on the north side of the peninsula. The night finds us nestled in the warm embrace of Langaholt guesthouse, promising a cozy haven after a day of exploration.

Captivating Snæfellsnes 23 September 2024

Awaken to the allure of the sunrise at Búðir church, setting the stage for a day of exploration in Arnarstapi village, Lóndrangar stacks, Djúpalónssandur, Svöðufoss waterfall, and the iconic Kirkjufell mountain.

Return to Langaholt for a restful night, as your senses revel in the captivating beauty of Snæfellsnes.

Southbound Splendors 24 September 2024

Greet the day with sunrise and breakfast, then bid farewell to Snæfellsnes as we journey southward to Vík.

Immerse yourself in the splendors of Seljalandsfoss, Skógafoss, Kvernufoss, and Dyrhólaey, culminating in a two-night stay at the picturesque Katla Hotel in Vík.



Glacial Grandeur 26 September 2024

After breakfast, journey to Jökulsárlón diamond beach, where glaciers dance with the waves. Explore Jökulsárlón and Fjallsárlón glacier lagoon, and revel in the grandeur of nearby glaciers.

The day concludes with a sunset spectacle at Jökulsárlón glacier lagoon, a symphony of colors reflected on the icy canvas.



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Peaks and Reflections 27 September 2024

As the sun graces Jökulsárlón with its first light, capture the magic of sunrise. After breakfast, venture towards Vestrahorn and Stokksnes for an awe-inspiring encounter with peaks and reflections.

Return to Jökulsárlón for a breathtaking sunset, a perfect encore to a day filled with photographic marvels.




Diamond Beach Magic 28 September 2024

The tour concludes in Reykjavík, a fitting finale to an extraordinary photographic journey.












WHY SEPTEMBER

Is Iceland on your bucket list? Don't dream it! Do it!












ICELAND FACTS

Iceland is a Nordic island nation in the North Atlantic. Reykjavik, its capital, is the northernmost capital of a sovereign state in the world.



Did you know?

- 1. Home to stunning landscapes, including geysers, waterfalls, and glaciers, Iceland has a population of around 366,000 people.
- 2. One of the most photographed locations in Iceland is the iconic Kirkjufell mountain. Located on the Snæfellsnes Peninsula, Kirkjufell is a beautifully symmetrical peak surrounded by scenic landscapes, waterfalls, and the nearby Kirkjufellsfoss waterfall. Its striking appearance has made it a favorite among photographers capturing the beauty of Iceland.
- 3. Renewable energy powers nearly 100% of its electricity and heating.
- 4. The country has a rich cultural heritage, including Norse sagas. Icelanders believe in elves and hidden people, known as "Huldufólk."
- 5. The Blue Lagoon is a famous geothermal spa attracting visitors worldwide.
- 6. Iceland sits on the Mid-Atlantic Ridge, making it geologically active with frequent volcanic
- 7. Iceland is home to numerous waterfalls, and it's challenging to provide an exact count as new ones are discovered, and some may not have been officially named. However, estimates suggest there are over 10,000 waterfalls in Iceland, ranging from small and unnamed falls to larger, well-known ones like Gullfoss, Seljalandsfoss, and Skogafoss. The abundance of waterfalls is a result of Iceland's diverse and dynamic landscape, with glacial rivers, volcanic terrain, and abundant precipitation contributing

to their formation.
