These tours offer photographers at all levels the chance to improve their skills and capture beautiful landscapes.










WHY SEPTEMBER

What to bring

- Filters if you have them (Polarizer/Graduated/ Neutral Density).
- Good walking boots.
- · Wet weather gear (rain will not hold us back).
- · A sense of fun and adventure.

What to wear

- Expect four seasons in one day! The weather can change very quickly in Lofoten. Showers one minute and sunshine the next.
- · Layering your clothing is best!
- Comfortable warm and waterproof clothing.
- Good supportive walking boots.
- · We will supply a suggested "What to bring" list.

Meals

Breakfast will be provided each day and a celebratory dinner at the end of our tour.

Meeting location

The tour begins at Leknes Airport, where we will meet you on the morning of the first day.
Alternatively, we can arrange a pickup from your accommodation in Leknes if you arrive a day earlier.

Fitness level requirements

- · A moderate level of fitness is required.
- All participants should be able to hike short distances to locations on uneven surface with their camera gear.
- Some areas have uneven ground, slopes, rocks and require extra due care and diligence.
- A lot of the places have reasonably easy access.
- Check with me before leaving and I can give you a better idea of any special fitness requirements you may need to complete the Tour.

Travel Insurance

Travel insurance is a compulsory part of booking our photography tours. Evidence of your travel insurance must be presented. Basically – if you don't have it, you cannot participate on the tour. Travel insurance must also cover you for COVID.
